Our 2nd Annual TRL Gift Card Drive!

The community service committee kicked off our second annual virtual gift card drive to help families transition in and out of temporary housing. This year, we raised over \$1,100 and purchased nearly 50 gift cards to help families in need.

As promised, the brothers bought gift cards and donated them to residents at the Carpenter's Shelter in Alexandria, Virginia. These gift cards go a long way. GENERAL CONVENTION

The 97th General Convention occurred in Dallas, Texas, from July 26 - July 30, 2023. The convention was attended by our Chapter President, Bro. Keith Laing, our chapter delegates (Bro. Lenard Williams, Bro. LeVar Crooms, Bro. Mark Forrest, Bro. DeGeorge Griffin, and Bro. Corey Quill), and over ten additional registered Theta Rho Lambda chapter brothers. The convention hosted a blood drive, which was done in honor of Jaden Blake. Bro. General President Willis Lonzer's daughter, Ms. Camille Adams-Lonzer, spoke to the general body on the importance of donating and her experience with sickle cell anemia.



About 5,200 people were registered at the convention. The public program was excellent, and the topic of "Politics 2023: Where Do We Go From Here?" was moderated by Bro. Roland Martin and included Bro. Ambassador Andrew Young, Bro. Freddie Haynes, and Shavon Arline-Bradley, president and CEO of NCNW. Three awards were presented at the public program. The Alpha Award of Honor was given to Dr. Shirley Ann Jackson, the first African American woman to receive a Ph.D. from MIT in any field and the first African American woman to chair "a Nuclear" board. Another Alpha Award of Honor was given to Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. for hosting programs that cross all communities, establishing historical efforts in HBCU fundraising, and opening the first black-owned and women-led financial institution, For Members Only Credit Union. A General President Citation was given to Glenda Glover, Ph.D. who was the 8th president of Tennessee State University, immediate past Supreme Basileus of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., 1st woman CPA-PhD, and one of two women nationwide who hold the PhD-CPA designation.

One of the major topics of discussion at the convention was moving the 2025 General Convention out of Florida. This was done in response to Gov. Ron DeSantis' policies. The brotherhood also narrowed the General President candidates down to the top two brothers, Bros. Lucien Metellus, Jr. and Gregory Parks. Overall, the convention was productive, informative, and well-attended.



CHAPTER RETREAT ROUNDTABLE WITH CHARTER MEMBER DANIEL L. BROWN

On June 10, 2023, the Brothers of Theta Rho Lambda gathered in Arlington VA for the annual planning retreat. This time-honored tradition marks the official end to business for the year and features a potluck of brother's favorite dishes followed by a social.

This year the brothers were surprised with a special lunch guest, Brother Rev. Dr. Daniel L. Brown, charter member of Theta Rho Lambda. Brother Reverend Doctor Brown spent 60 minutes of his time sharing stories and imparting words of wisdom to the brothers in attendance. He recalled the early days of organizing brothers of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. who resided in Northern Virginia, and detailed the steps taken to officially charter the first chapter in this area outside of Washington DC. Brother Rev. Dr. Daniel L. Brown shared some special moments of interest in Theta Rho Lambda that included the crossing of his grandson Jarryd Taylor in the Fall of 2007. Last, he offered advice on how to balance service to fraternity and life. He received a spirit ovation at the conclusion of his talk.
